Presented July 9, 2019

Methodology

- ▶ Mixed-mode survey of City of Davis voters
 - Voters were contacted for phone interviews via landline and cell phone, and to complete a web version of the survey via email and text invitation
- ▶ Conducted May 23-31, 2019
- ▶ 500 completed interviews; overall margin of error ± 4.38 percentage points
- ▶ Where applicable, results compared with:

Project Purpose

- ▶ Understand satisfaction with City of Davis services, features, and quality of life
- ▶ Determine the likelihood of success of a measure to renew the City's one percent sales tax
- ▶ Explore the preferred methods of communication about Davis news and events

Key Findings

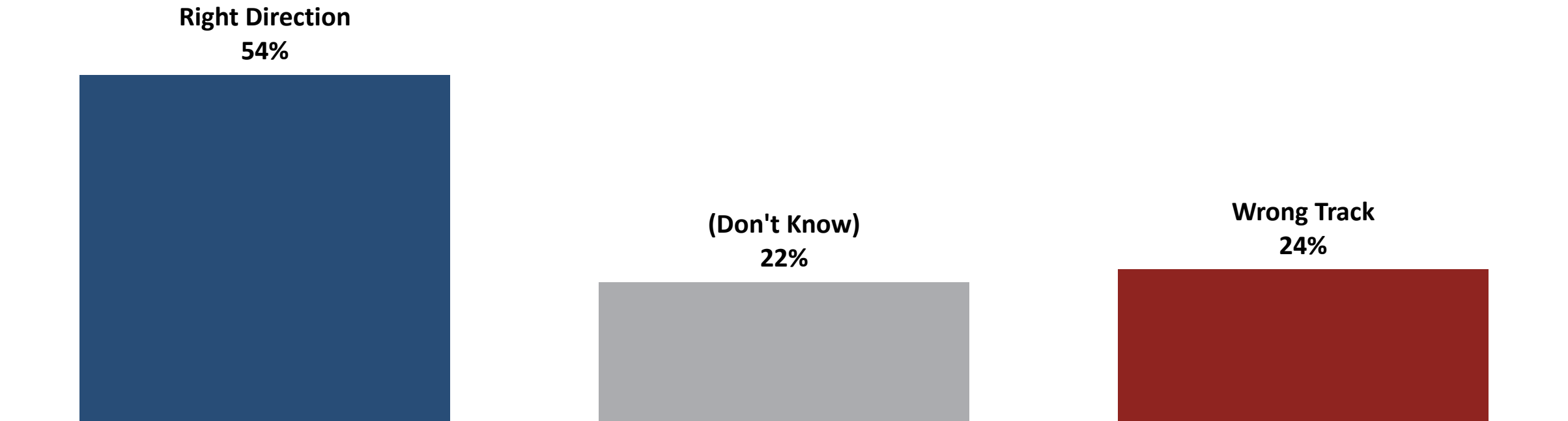
- ▶ Voters are overwhelmingly satisfied with the local quality of life in Davis, as well as safety, the City's image and reputation and many services provided by the City.
- ▶ Most voters trust the City's leaders to solve difficult problems and have confidence in the management of tax dollars.
- ▶ There is significant concern about housing affordability.
- ▶ The vast majority of voters would support a measure to renew the City's one percent sales tax.
- ▶ Maintaining emergency response times and maintaining City roads, sidewalks and bike paths are particularly high priorities.
- ▶ The Davis Enterprise stands out as a useful source of news and events about things happening in Davis. Social media and the City's website are also viewed as useful by many.

Right Direction/Wrong Track

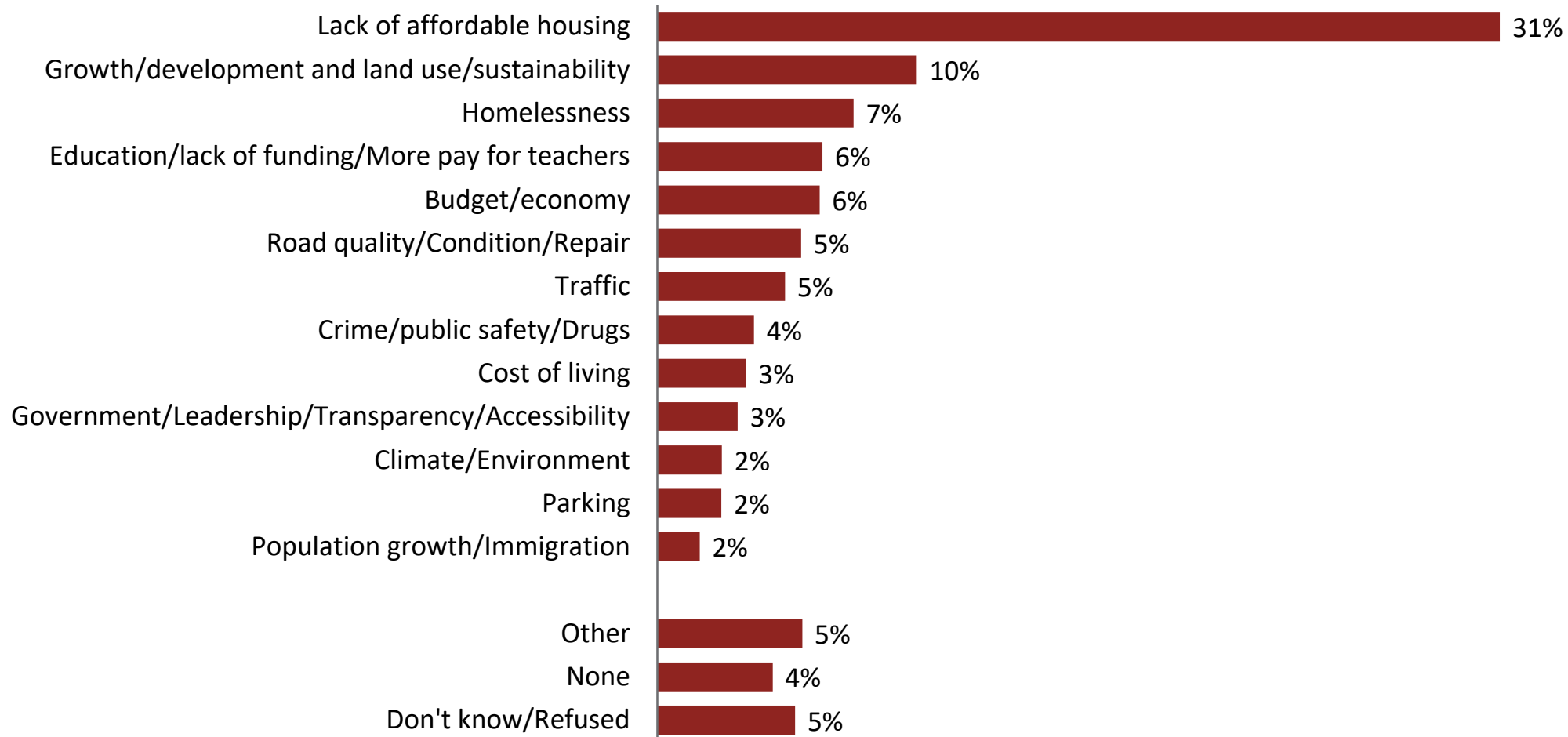
Over half of Davis voters are optimistic about the direction of the City.



Q3. Do you feel that things in the City of Davis are generally going in the right direction or do you feel things have gotten pretty seriously off on the wrong track?

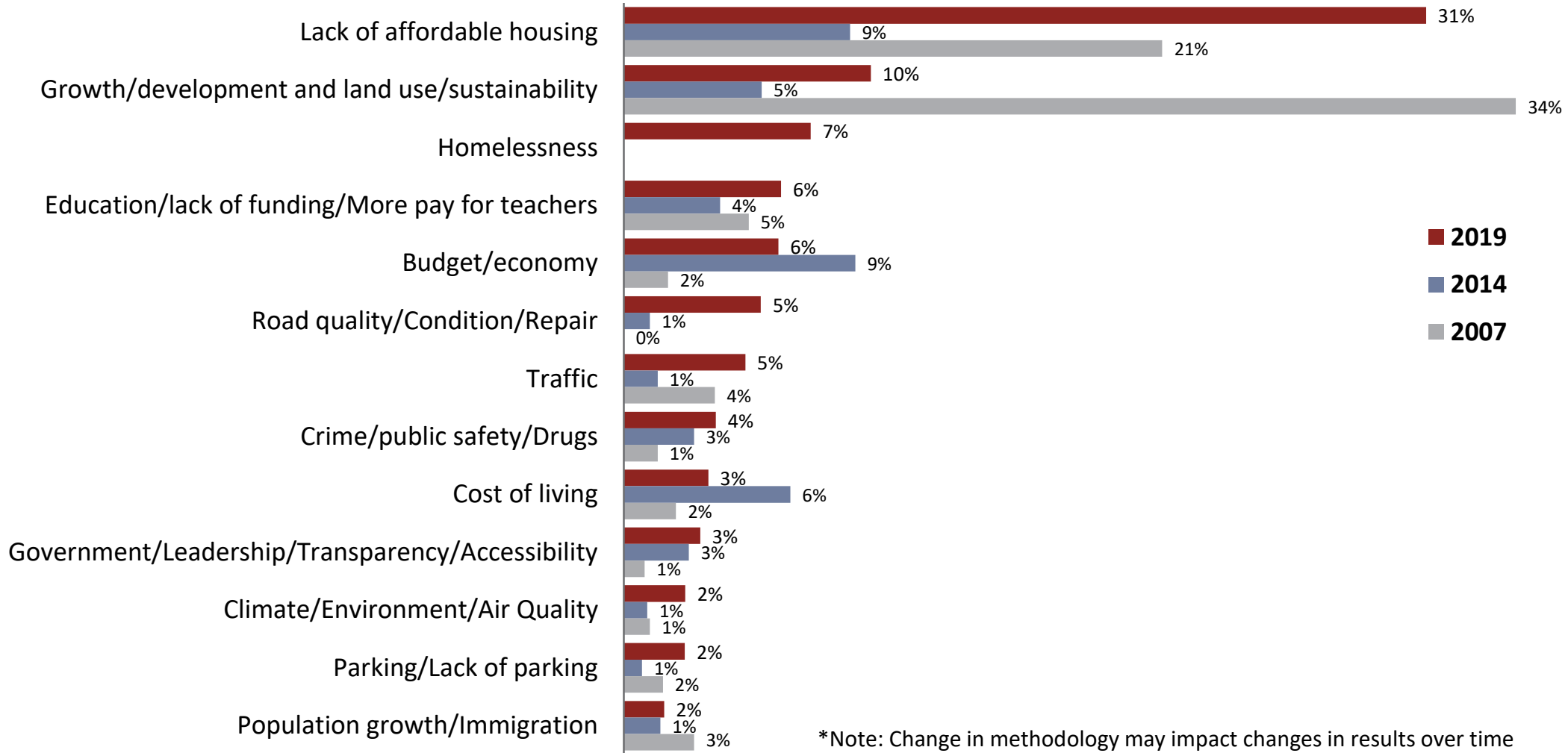
City of Davis Most Important Problem

Housing affordability remains a top concern, and homelessness has emerged as a prominent concern this year.

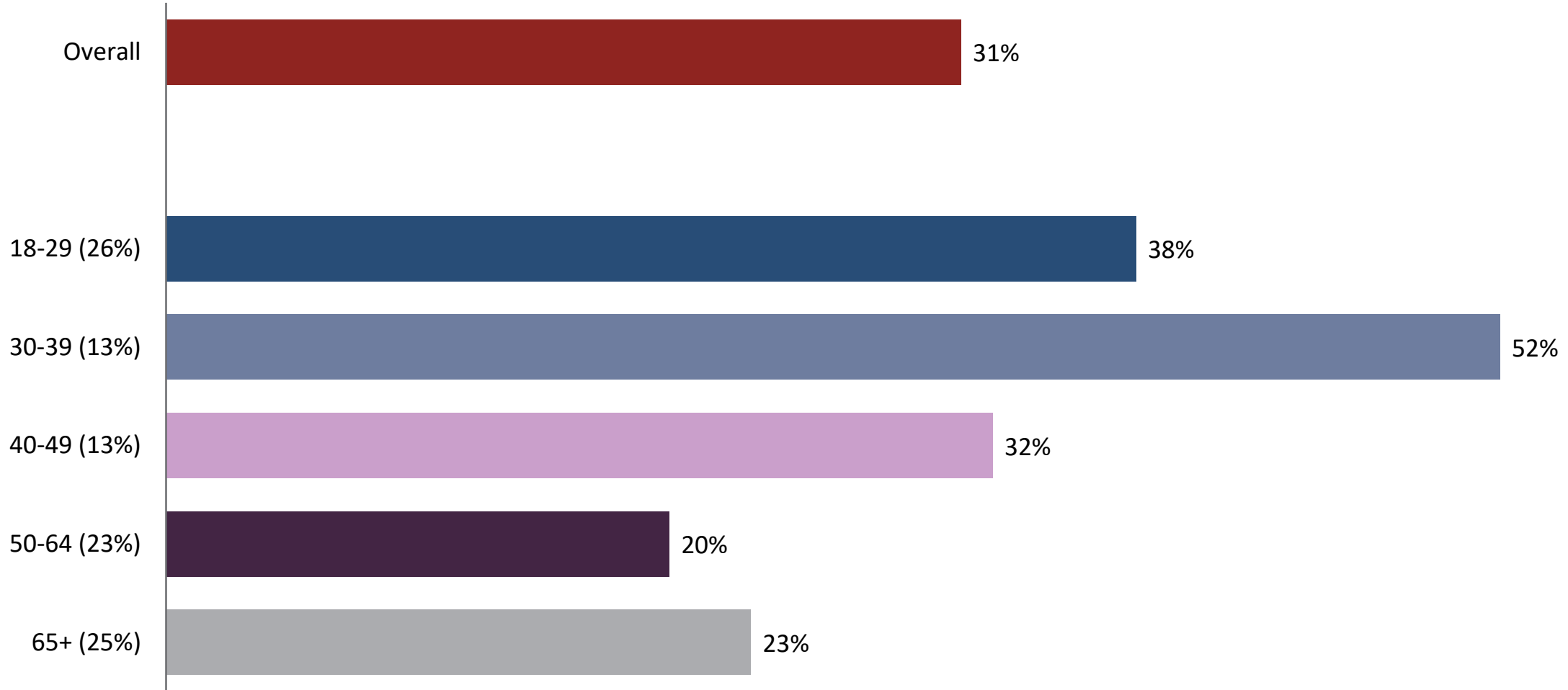

Q4. What do you think is the most important issue facing the City of Davis today? (Previous wording “What do you feel is the most important issue facing residents of Davis?”)

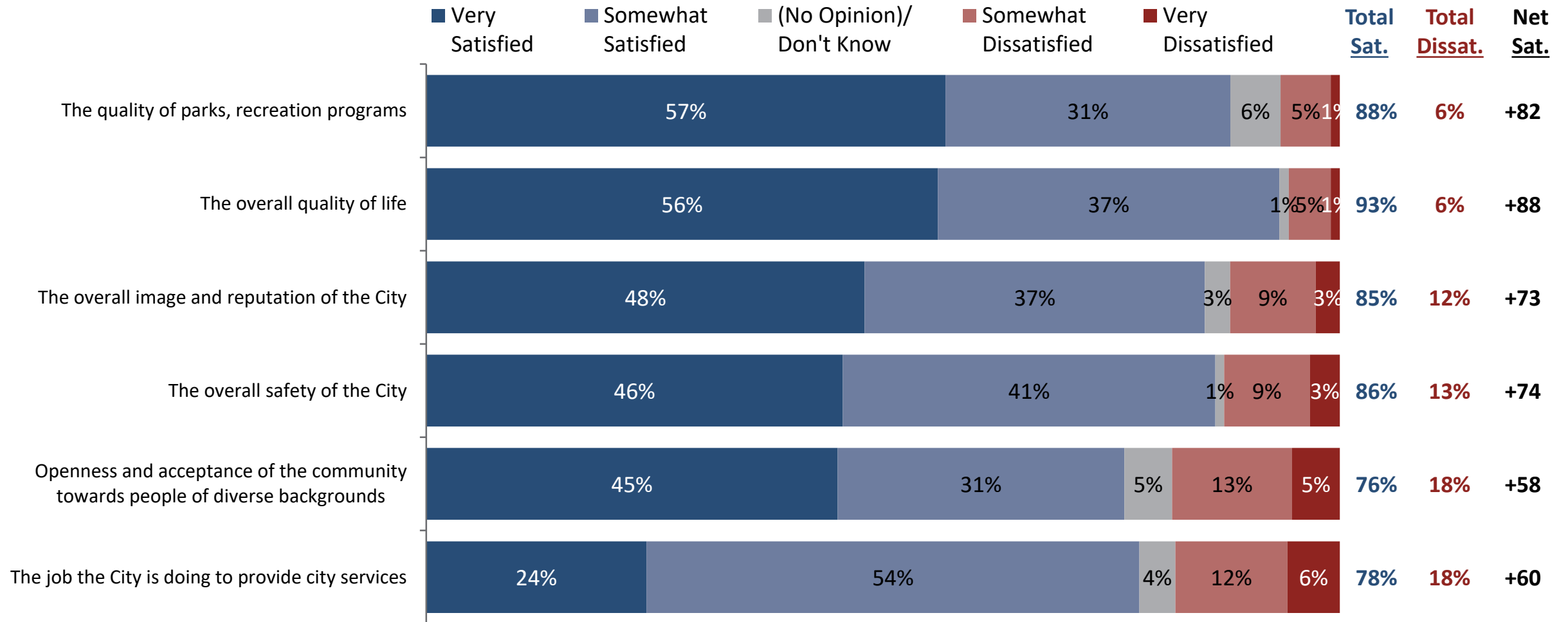
Lack of Affordable Housing By Age

City Satisfaction Ratings

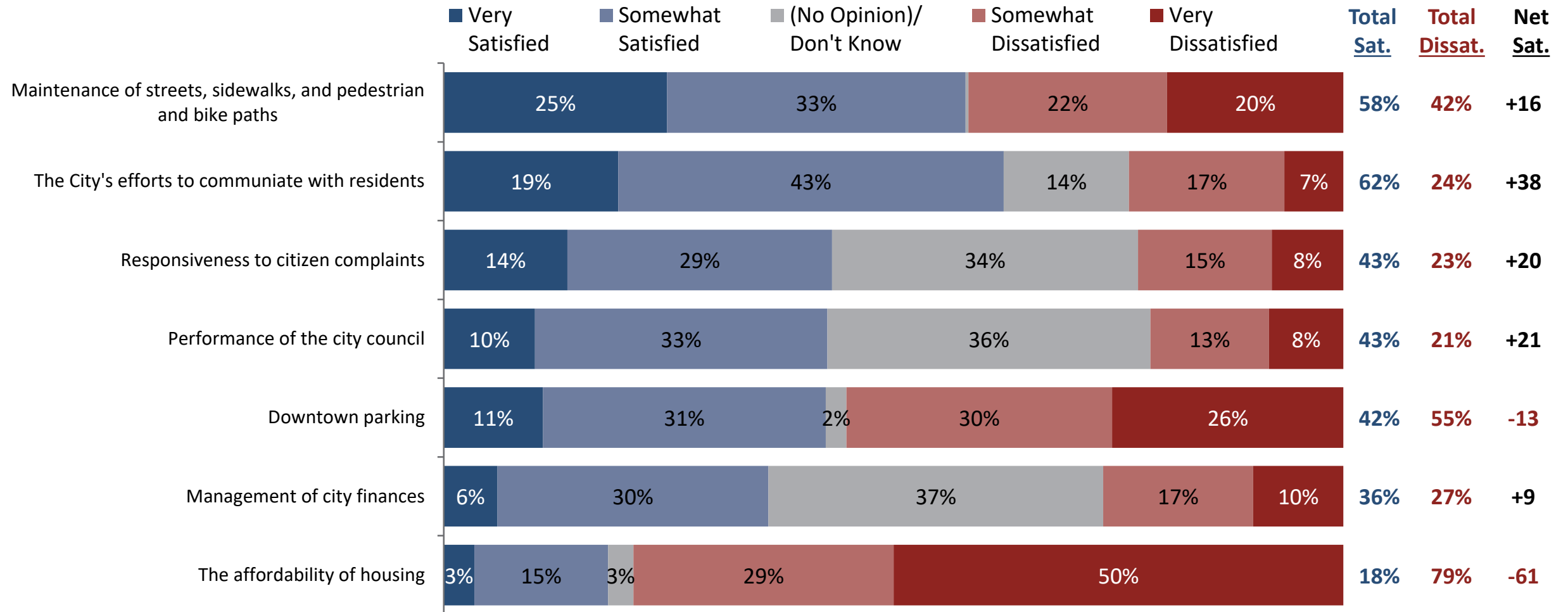
Voters are very satisfied with the quality of parks and recreation and the overall quality of life in Davis. The City also receives high ratings for image and reputation, safety, and acceptance of people of diverse backgrounds.

City Satisfaction Ratings

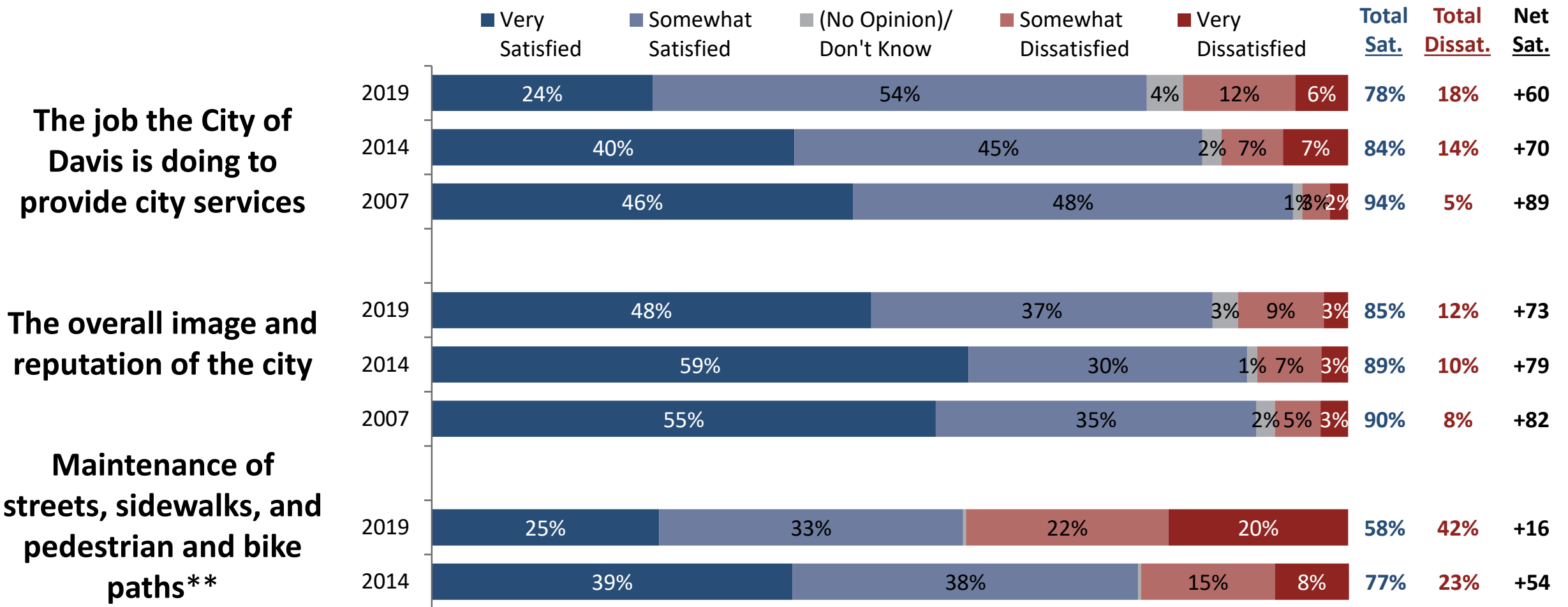
Housing affordability is an area of significant concern, with half indicating they are very dissatisfied.

City Satisfaction Ratings Over Time*

Satisfaction with the image and reputation of the City has remained fairly consistent over time. Overall satisfaction with providing services is similar to prior years, but intensity has decreased.

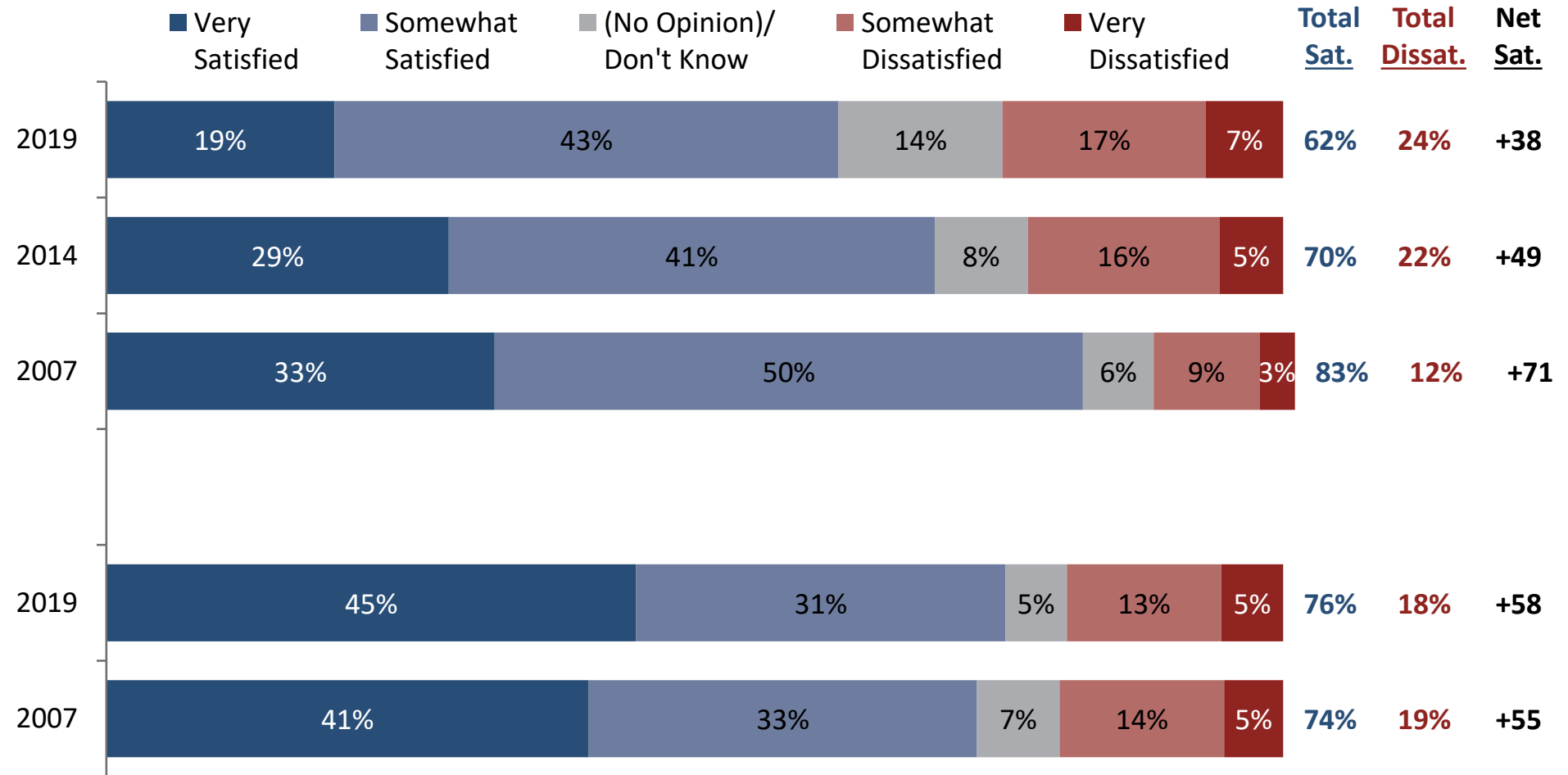

Openness and acceptance of the community toward people of diverse backgrounds*

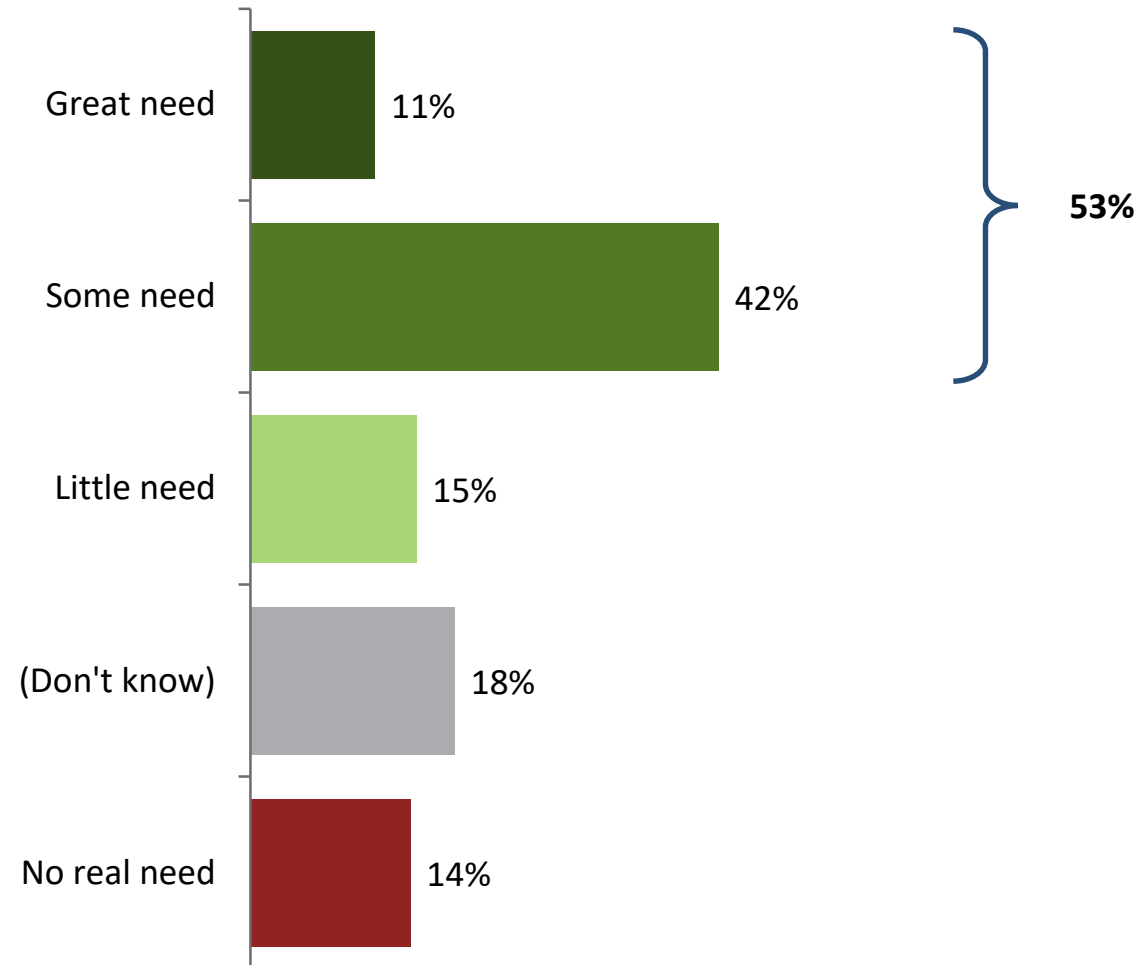

Just over half of voters believe that the City of Davis has at least some need for additional funding.

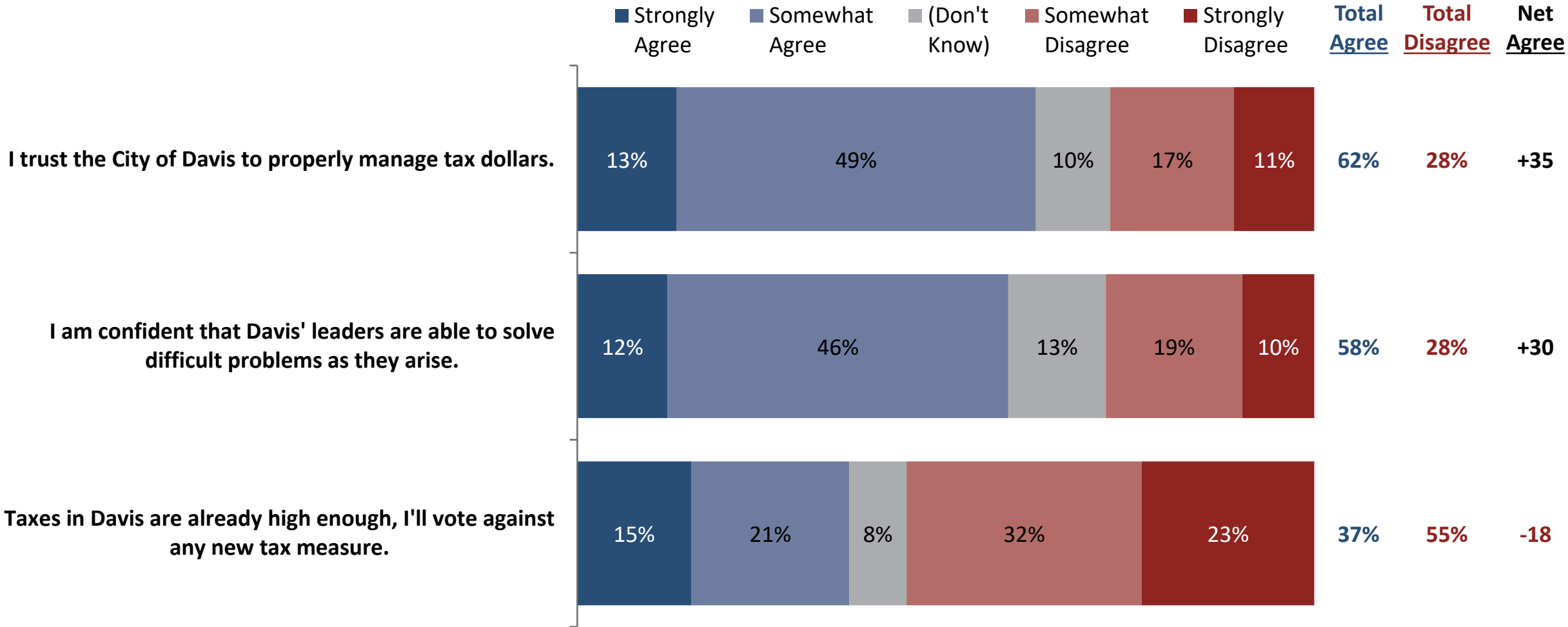


Q5. Would you say that the City of Davis has a great need for more money, some need for more money, only a little need for more money, or no real need for more money for city services?

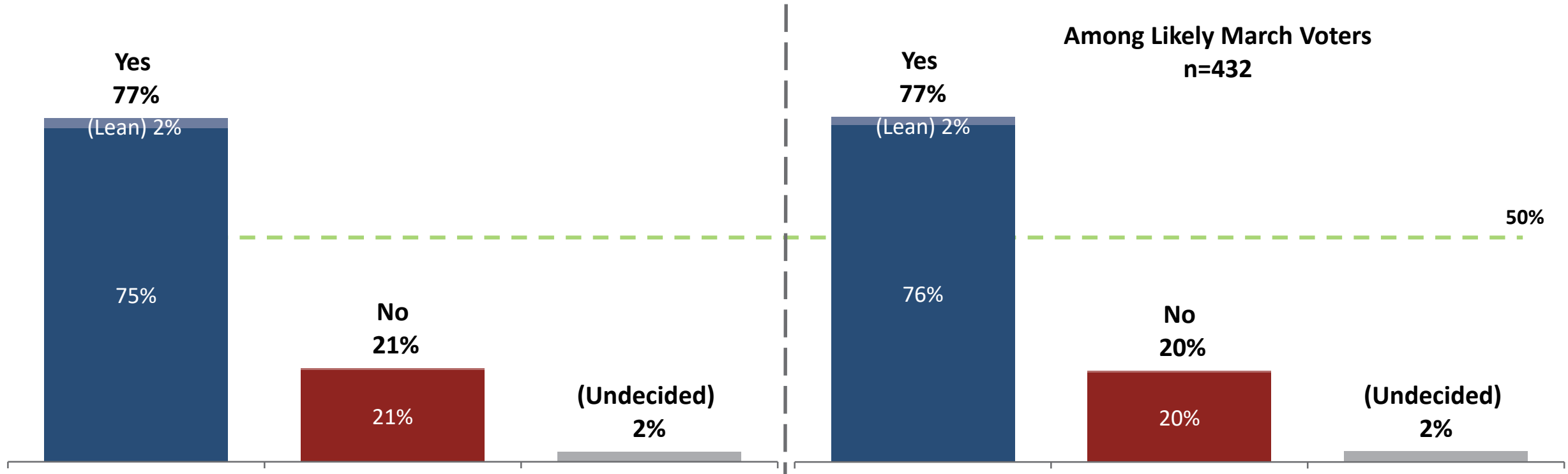


Sales Tax Measure

Sales Tax: Initial Support

The sales tax extension begins in a strong position, with over three in four voters supporting it.

Shall the Ordinance extending the existing one percent sales tax with no increase to the current rate, providing approximately \$8,500,000 annually until repealed by the voters, subject to annual review, with all funds staying local, and continuing existing funding for city services such as police, fire, recreation programs, city roads, sidewalks, bike path maintenance and other city services, be adopted?

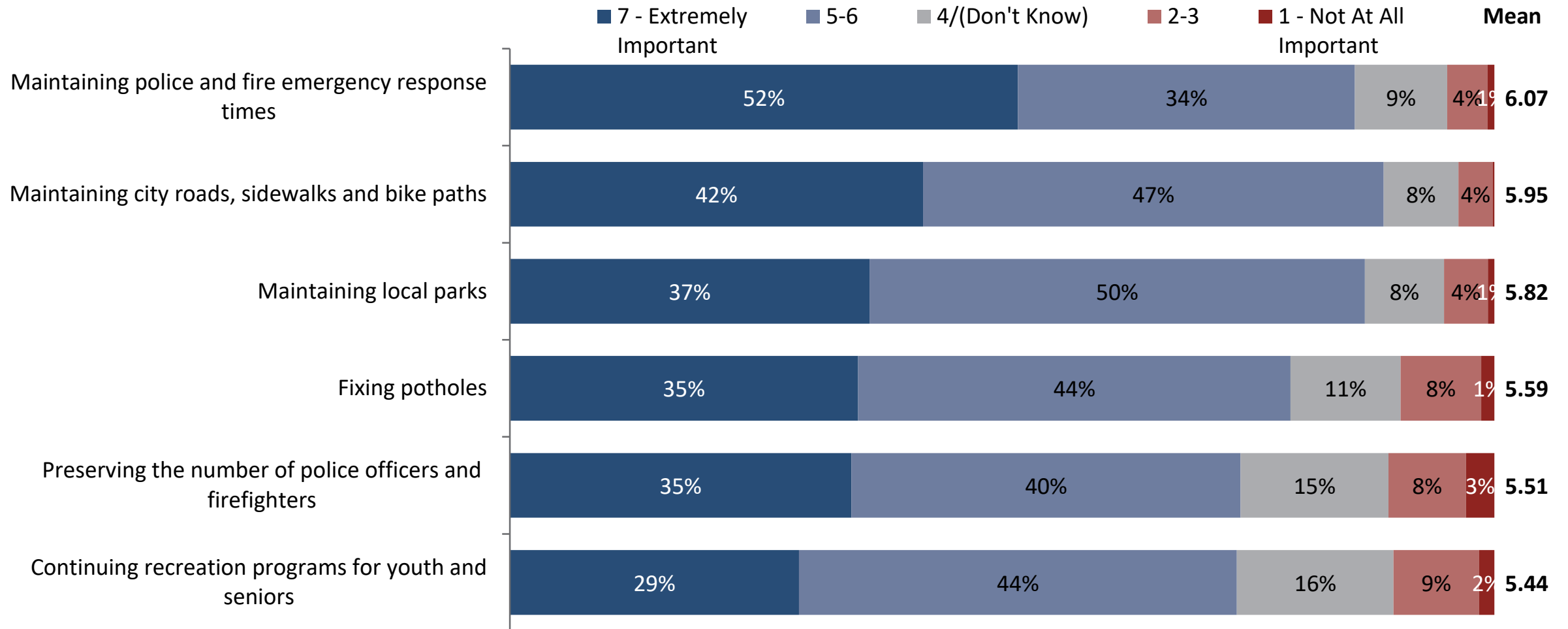

Maintaining fire and police emergency response times is an important priority; maintaining roads, sidewalks, bike paths, and parks is also very important.



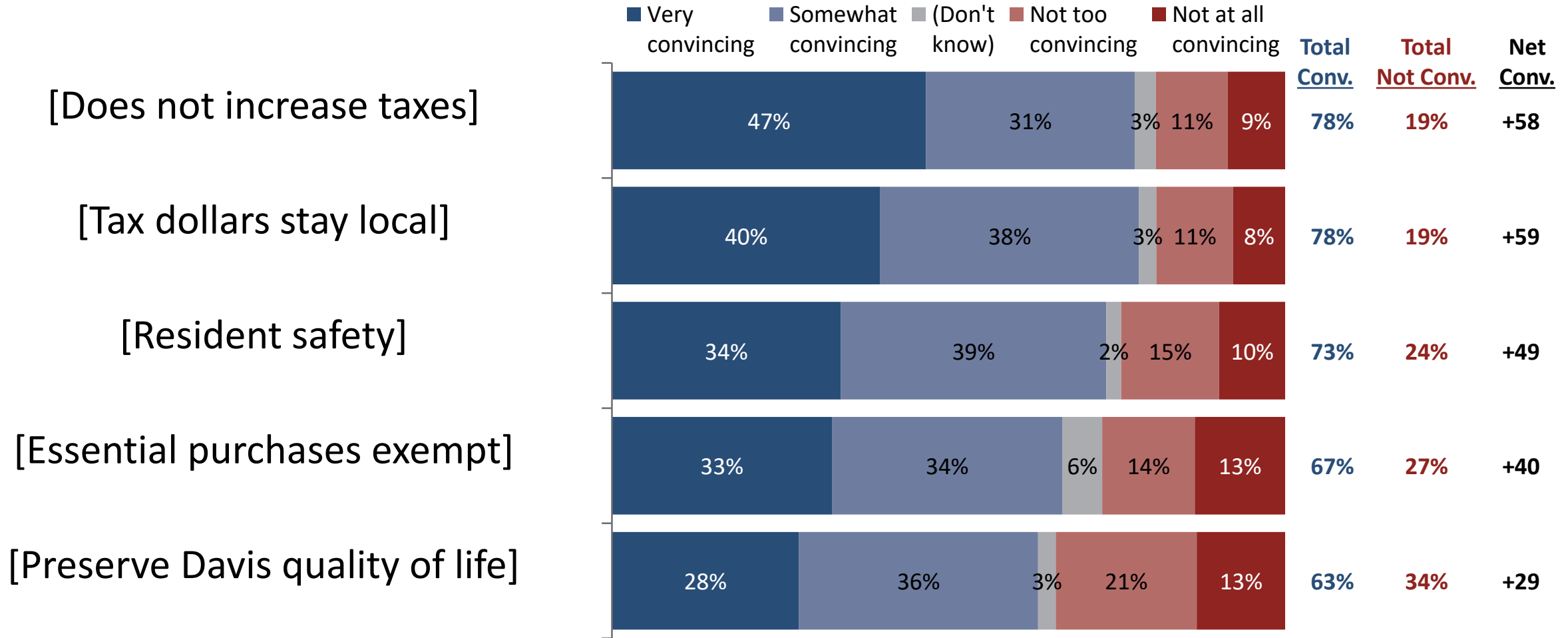

The fact that this measure would not increase taxes and that all funds benefit Davis are convincing reasons to support it.



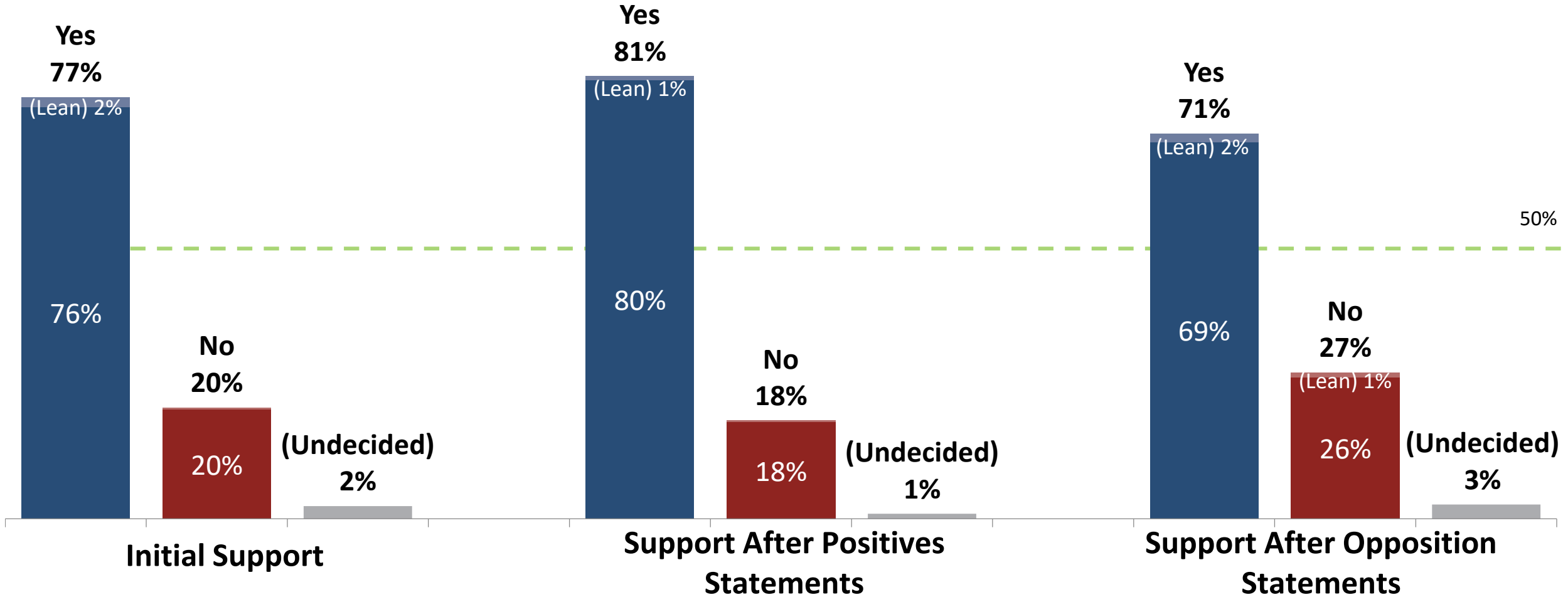

Among Likely March voters; n=432

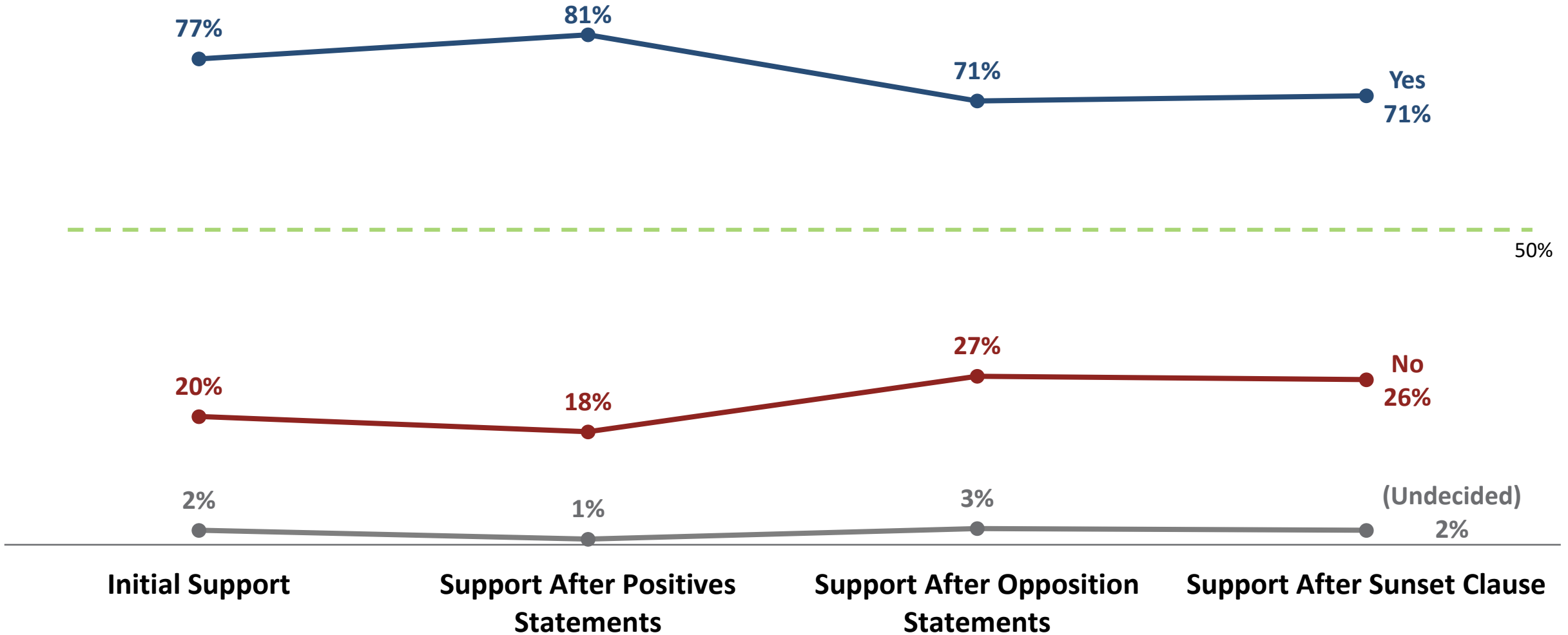


Q37/38. Now given everything you've heard, if the election were held today would you vote yes to approve or no to reject the renewal of the existing one percent sales tax measure for Davis?

Among Likely March voters; n=432



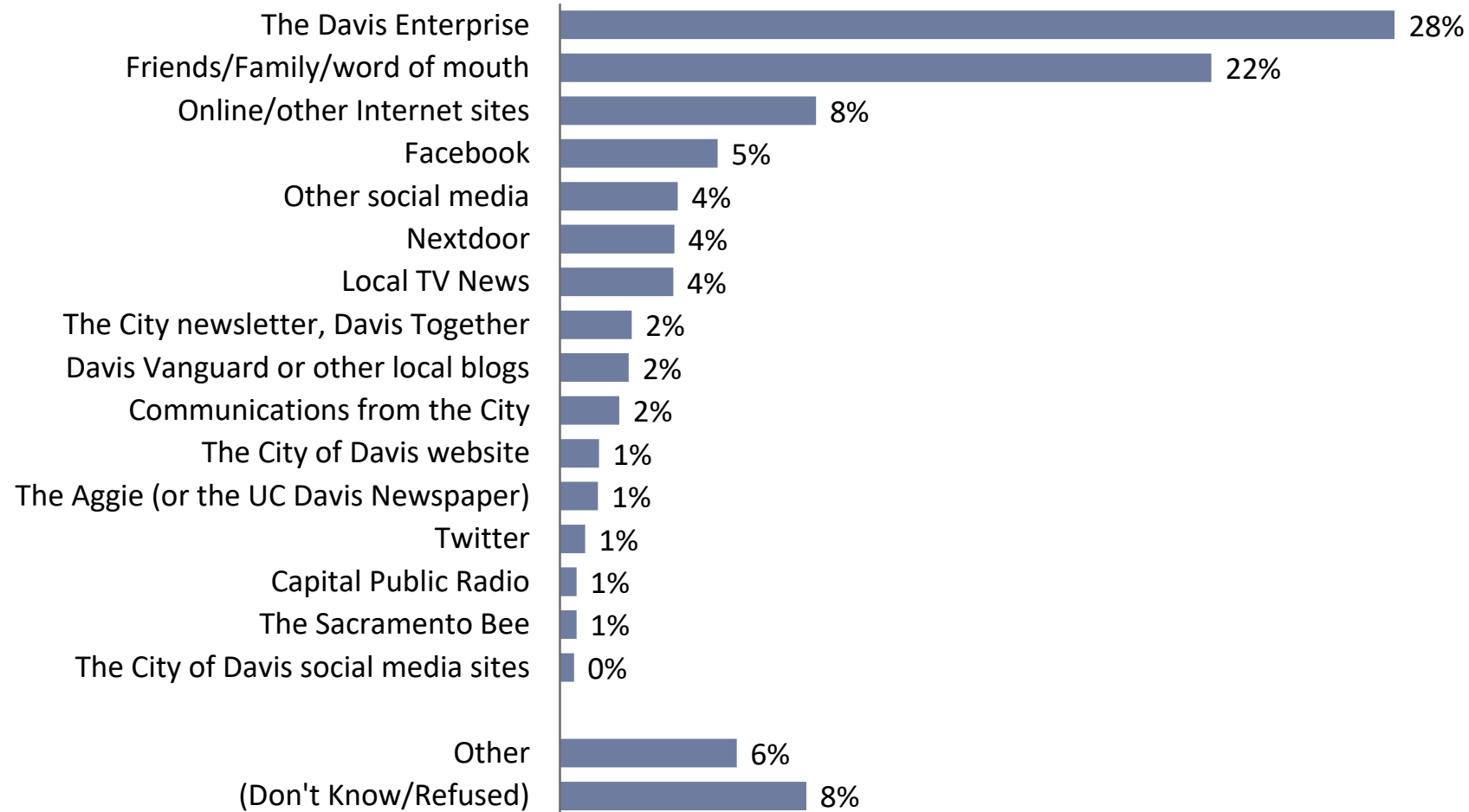

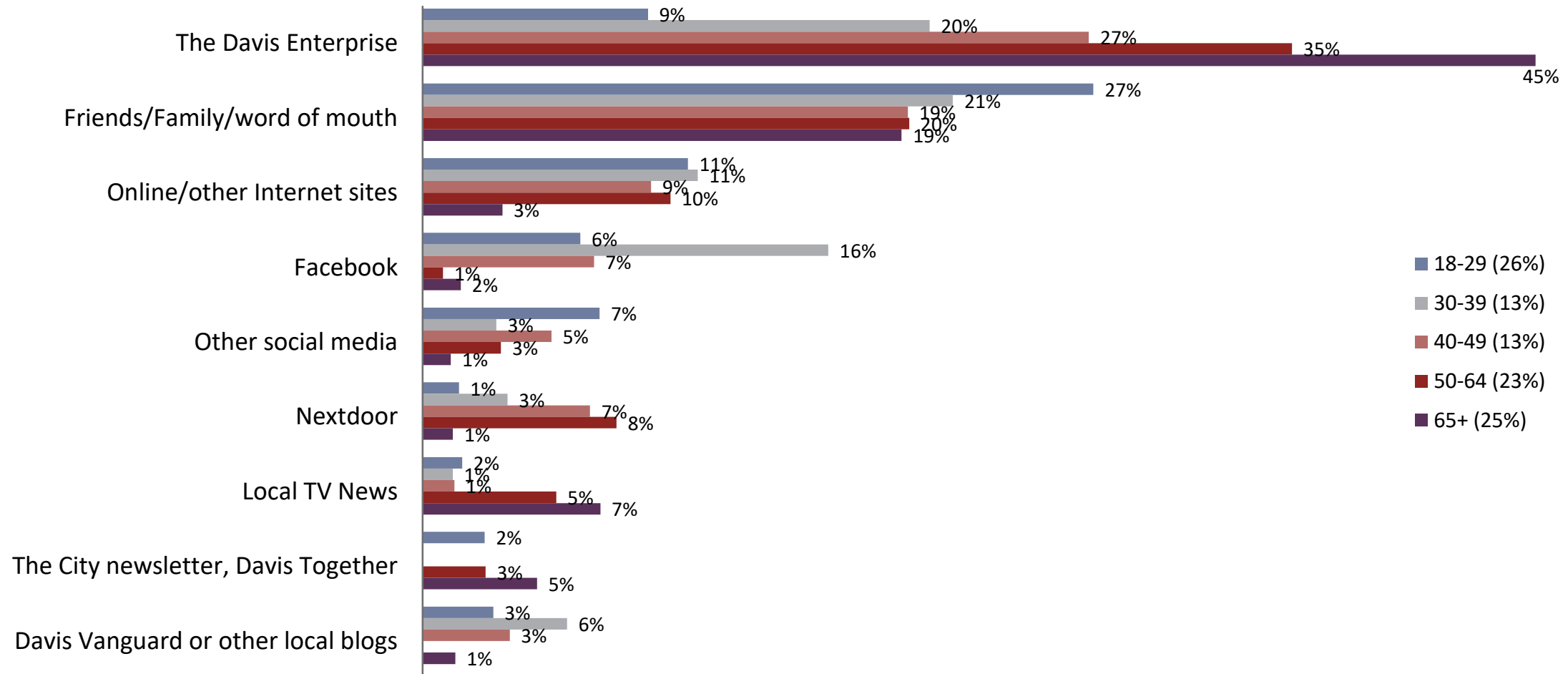
Most Important Source for Local News

The Davis Enterprise and word-of-mouth are the foremost top-of-mind sources for local news and events.



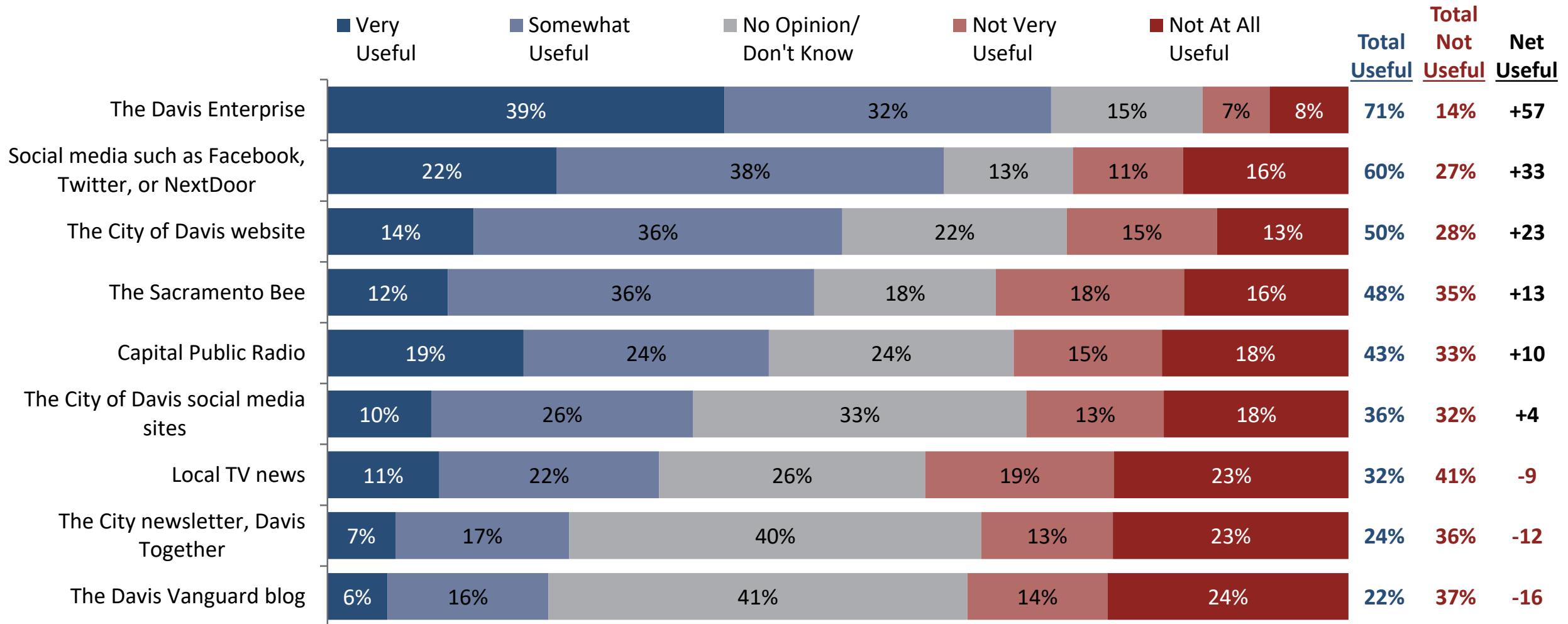
Most Important Source for Local News by Age

Usefulness of Local News Sources

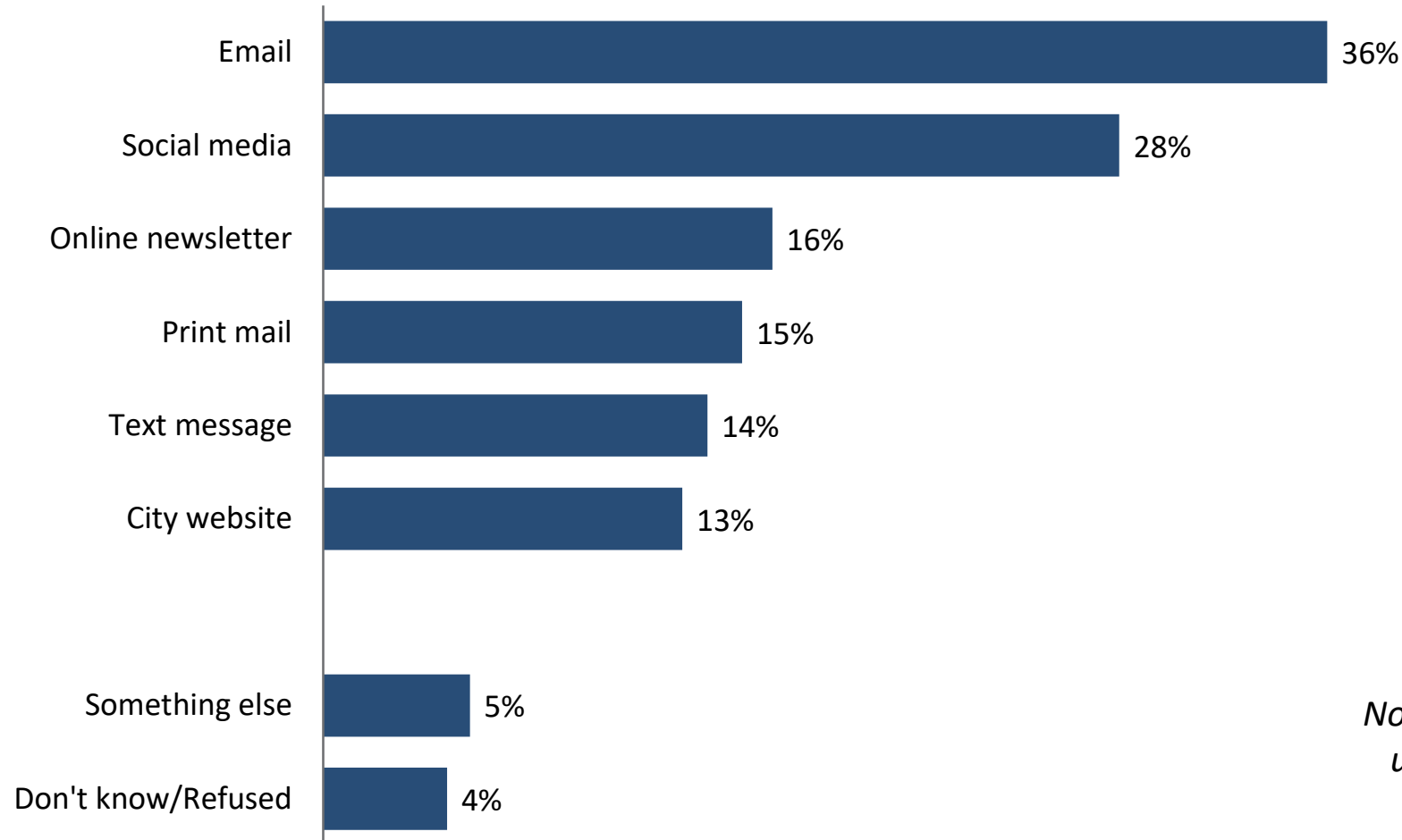
Many say the Davis Enterprise and social media are useful sources of information about local news and events.
