FOR OR AGAINST CITY MEASURES TO BE SUBMITTED TO THE ELECTORS
OF THE CITY OF DAVIS ON JUNE 7, 2016**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a General Municipal and Special Election will be held in the City of Davis on **Tuesday, June 7, 2016**, for the following Officers and Measures:

For 3 Members of the City Council (Full term of four years)

CITY OF DAVIS MEASURE “A”	
Shall Resolution 16-014 amending the Davis General Plan to change the land use designation for the Nishi property from Agriculture to University-Related Research Park, as set forth in the Resolution and establishing the Baseline Project Features for development of the Nishi Project be approved?	YES

CITY OF DAVIS MEASURE “B”	
Shall Ordinance 2468 be adopted to amend, effective August 1, 2016, Article 15.05 of the Davis Municipal Code to increase the City of Davis’s Transient Occupancy Tax, imposed on occupants of short-term rentals such as hotel rooms, from 10% to 12%, and apply TOT to total rent paid by a guest for the short-term rental, including online travel companies, which is anticipated to raise \$240,000 annually and will continue until repealed by City Council or city voters? CITY OF DAVIS MEASURE “C”	
Shall Ordinance 2469 be adopted to add Article 19.04.100 to the Davis Municipal Code to establish a business license tax on non-medical (recreational) marijuana businesses within the city of no more than 10% of annual gross receipts of the business, which is estimated to raise \$200,000 annually if recreational marijuana sales are legalized and the City amends zoning to authorize marijuana businesses within City limits, and which will continue until repealed by City Council or city voters? NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that arguments for or against these measures may be submitted to the City Clerk, 23 Russell Boulevard, Suite 4, Davis, CA, 95616, **no later than 5:00 p.m. on March 11, 2016**, which has been determined by the elections official to be a reasonable date based upon the time necessary to prepare and print arguments. No argument shall exceed 300 words in length. Pursuant to Section 9287 of the Elections Code, one argument for and one argument against these measures will be selected for printing and distribution to the voters with the sample ballot. Arguments may be changed or withdrawn until and including the date fixed by the City Clerk.

The elections official will provide opportunity for rebuttal arguments in accordance with Section 9285 of the Elections Code. Rebuttal arguments shall not exceed 250 words and must be filed **no later than 5:00 p.m. on March 21, 2016**.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that any impartial analysis, direct argument or rebuttal filed under the authority of the California Elections Code will be available for public examination in the City Clerk's Office for not less than 10 calendar days from the filing deadlines.
