Recognizing that the old adage, "An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure" definitely applies to oral health, we are focusing our efforts to provide needed dental health care supplies to disadvantaged and under served populations in our Davis community and surrounding. All public and dental health professionals agree that the first line of defense in community dental health care is developing and encouraging proper oral health care practices. This can pay large dividends later in terms of avoiding more extensive treatment options later many of which require emergency room treatments. Unknown to many, there is a large segment of the Davis community population that lives below the federal poverty level and does not have funds to purchase or have access to free basic oral health care and supplies.

The Davis Oral Health Project is requesting CDBG funds to purchase toothpastes, toothbrushes, and bilingual instructions to be assembled in dental care kits or individually provided for distribution to the most disadvantaged and needy of these populations in Davis via distribution by service organizations that directly serve these disadvantaged families and homeless citizens. Following are the recipient organizations who received over 2,700 dental health care kits distributed by Davis Oral Health Care Project in calendar year 2019.

Davis Oral Health Care Projects estimates that among these recipient organizations, they could beneficially use 2,000 dental care kits we propose to provide to them for distribution to their Davis clientele within a 12 month period financed using CDBG funds during FY 2020-2021.

Each disadvantaged recipient will receive the following basic dental health care kit at the indicated price:

This price is only for materials. All labor to order, assemble, and deliver the kits will be voluntary. The total project cost for 2,000 kits to be delivered during 2020-2021 under this CDBG program is as follows

The kits do not include mouthwash because of the potential for leaks and abuse by alcoholic recipients. Nor do the kits include other perio-cleaning aids (tooth pick, holders, and proxi-brushes) because of the possibility of breakage and swallowing by children.

c. <u>Outreach</u> (Describe the outreach your organization will provide for the CDBG-funded project, as well as provide a list of the languages currently included in your organizational outreach)

Outreach to the homeless, disadvantaged, and needy families regarding the availability of the dental care kits and distribution of the kits to those populations will be provided by the recipient agency who best know and understand their clients' needs and capabilities and provide the distribution networks for their other services and supplies. Outreach to recipient individuals are conducted primarily in English and Spanish. All dental care instructions provided are bilingual English and Spanish.

d. Organizational Capacity (Summarize your organizational capacity for the proposed project)

Davis Oral Health Project has been distributing dental oral health care kits since 2016 and have distributed over 10,000 kits to disadvantaged recipients or those in temporary need. The following are members of our Board of Directors.- Dr. Cynthia Belgum, DDS, Dr. Henry Bennett DDS, Barbara King, Pam Nieberg, Alan Pryor, and John Troidl, MPH.

Davis Oral Health Project is a California 501(c)3 non-profit corporation and contributions are deductible under section 170 of the Code per the advice letter on file from the IRS (copies available on request). Our Federal EIN is 46-5013475, our California Corporation No. is 3645880, and our California Attorney General Registry of Non-Profits No. is CT0207522.

Operating funds for Davis Oral Health Project are obtained through donations by individuals including Board members, corporate matching grants, and donations from other non-profit organizations. Davis Oral Health care Project is approved by Benevity as a recognized recipient of corporate matching grant donations. Benevity is the global leader in online workplace giving, matching, volunteering and integrated grant management solutions and approved recipients must meet a rigorous due diligence and qualification process ensuring sound organization responsibility and governance.

e. <u>Partnerships and Other Resources</u> (List other agencies you collaborate with and indicate whether or not your proposed project is duplicative of other projects operated by local public or non-profit organizations)

Davis Oral Health Project will offer our donations of CDBG-funded dental care kits only to non-profit organizations serving Davis residents only who defined as Limited Clientele organizations under HUD regulations meaning they provide services to indiviuals and families of which at least 51% are definced as low or moderate income. These complete kits are not provided by any other local organizations except on a very intermittant and extremely limited basis. We expect to provide dental kits, at minimum, to the following organizations with whom we have previously worked for distribution to their Davis clientele:

- 1. Davis Community Meals Provides meals and services for homeless, senior, and disadvantaged people.
- 2. **STEAC (Short Term Emergency Aid Committee)** Provides material aid assistance by distributing food and clothing to those with incomes at or below the poverty level or in temporary transitional difficulties.
- 3. **Empower Yolo** Provides food, material, and housing assistance to abused women and families.
- 4. **Family Resources Center** (now part of Empower Yolo) Provides food, material, and advisory resources to about disadvantaged families.
- 5. **Yolo Crisis Nursery** Provides emergency housing and food and materials to disadvantaged families with young children.
- 6. Yolo Food Bank Provides emergency food for disadvantaged, low income, and homeless people.
