1. Roll Call/Introductions

4. Public Comment

5. City Items
 - City General Plan
Mike Webb: The city is working to broaden the core area specific plan update process. Staff is currently reviewing the RFP's that were submitted by consultants and hope to provide council with a recommended firm by July 11. The initial focus is on the downtown area and after about a year, that would dovetail into a general plan update effort for the entire city in 18/19.
6. County/City Shared Items
 - 32A/105 Proposed Project
Patrick Blacklock: One remaining outstanding issue with this project is agricultural equipment. The levee is an impediment to the farm equipment. Current plan is that one lane would be a 2-way bike lane and the remaining lane would be for traffic heading east with a protective barrier between these lanes.
Taro Ichiburu: Crossing at the top of the levee is an issue, but can be dealt with, but the bigger issue is the size of the equipment and trying to maneuver getting onto the levee.
Provenza: There's been some discussion in allowing the farm equipment on the bike lane.

Diane Swann: The cyclists don't have an issue with the farm equipment since they're slow moving vehicles.
John Swann: As far as sharing, there needs to be some kind of provision for the bikes (turnouts) for on-coming traffic.
 - Davis Creek Mobile Home Park Annexation
There was discussion about the annexation of Davis Creek Mobile Home Park. City staff is doing some research before committing to anything. City staff plans to come to council on July 11 with a preliminary conversation with ideas.

- Potential city-sponsored infrastructure projects in Yolo Bypass (Davis Wetlands Water Supply and South Davis Drain Configuration)

This item was withdrawn

- Consideration of stop sign at Mace Blvd./Montgomery Ave.

There's been an increase of traffic coming from Tremont through this area because of phone apps that directs traffic through that area. Traffic comes through at high speeds.

Bob Clarke: This raises a question about all roads leading in to the city. All roads lead to county roads where speeds are higher than within city limits. Although the stop signs are in the city, advanced warning strips should be on the county side.

- UC Davis Long Range Development Project

Blacklock: Both the City and the County have adopted resolutions regarding LRDP process.

Matt Dulcich: Campus LRDP is a programmatic plan for how the campus might grow. There needs to be more conversation as to what is expected from the university and if these requests are realistic.

The city and the county are asking for clarification on what the plan is for phasing and what the final numbers are for housing. There are impacts of growth, such as transportation and housing for surrounding communities.

Dulcich: 40/90 is not an absolute cap in terms of the CEQA analysis (housing 40% of the overall enrollment and 90% of the new growth). Ultimately the regents approve the LRDP.

Public comment:

Greg Rowe: This plan isn't realistic. Regents wants to increase enrollment, but not enough housing to cover this increase.
