5. Discussion Items

A. COVID-19 Emergency Response

Blacklock: Provided background on events and restrictions that have been put into effect since the beginning of the pandemic. Explained how there are different stages, and permitted activities based on metrics, and the attestation process. Provided an update on the number of cases in the county.

Webb: Talked about how the city is working on clarity in messaging, in particular to the business community, for example through a Q&A informational session being held by the Chamber of Commerce.

Blacklock: No advance warning is given before the State's press releases as to what actions will be taken, which doesn't allow for the County to make preparations in advance for the actions needed.

Provenza: Shared that the Board took action to require tracing and testing of all individuals that have access to the nursing homes and senior care facilities.

Saylor: Commented on how that even when the attestation is filed, everyone still needs to be careful as to what steps take place afterwards. There will be very detailed guidelines.

B. Project Roomkey (COVID-19 Homeless Sheltering Program)

– Next steps

Sandra Sigrist (Yolo County Health and Human Services): Provided an overview of the program that is providing rooms at hotels for vulnerable homeless individuals. Area 4 on Aging is providing food delivery and Communicare is providing medical care to these individuals that are in the motels. Talked about the different funding sources and that the expectation is that FEMA would reimburse a large portion of the cost.

The Executive Commission to Address Homelessness is looking for some more permanent solutions on homelessness
