

## November 19, 2019 City Council Debrief:

### Joint Discussion with Social Services Commission:

Commissioners presented overview of 2019 accomplishments and proposed 2020 activities, including research ways to better incorporate data, and raise awareness of issues related to food insecurity, child care access, seniors, citizens with disabilities, and mental health. Councilmembers provided feedback on their individual social services priorities.

Individual comments were provided for additional design items.
