A. Discussion of Next Steps Related to Defining Community Health and Public Safety Improvements (Attachment 2)

At the July 23, 2020 Commission meeting, the Commission appointed a subcommittee to join the Police Accountability Commission and the Social Services Commission for discussion regarding the City Council's June 16 directive on community health and public safety. The Human Relations Commission continued the discussion and provided subcommittee members feedback to bring to the subcommittee meeting.

Highlighted concepts include:

- Review organizational structure to see if makes sense to move non police programs out of department
- Homeless programs look to what is working currently, prior to recommended changes.
- City to work closely with county in regards to mental health and drug and alcohol issues.
- Look to restorative justice and youth and prevention programs.
- o Education to community on police department currently does.
- See where funds can be obtained and reallocated for mental health resources, etc.
- Explore different ideas and models and encourage them to have education and youth component included.
- Consider utilizing focus groups for feedback, as they often have larger impact.
- Keep in mind that group is not tasked with solving the problems or restructuring, but to provide thoughts and ideas as to what can be further researched, etc.

B. Designation of Additional Subcommittee Member for Joint Subcommittee

With the resignation of a member, the Commission designated a new appointment to serve on the joint subcommittee made up of the Police Accountability Commission, the Social Services Commission and the Human Relations Commission.

Roland moved with second by O'Rourke-Powell that Sheila Allen be appointed to subcommittee. Motion passed as follows:
