Subject: Item 5B – Senate Bill 1383 Introduction and Informational Items for Review

#### Recommendations

Receive information and helpful links on Senate Bill 1383 (also called: Short-Lived Climate Pollutants: Organic Waste Methane Emissions Reductions).

# **Background and Final Rulemaking**

In September 2016, SB 1383 was signed into law, establishing methane emissions reduction targets in a statewide effort to reduce emissions of short-lived climate pollutants in various sectors of California's economy. As it pertains to solid waste, SB 1383 establishes targets to achieve a 50 percent reduction in the level of the statewide disposal of organic waste by 2020, and a 75 percent reduction by 2025. In addition, the regulations require that at least 20 percent of edible food that is currently disposed of is recovered for human consumption by 2025. These regulations represent the most far-reaching changes to the solid waste industry in California since 1989, when AB 939 first required recycling and waste diversion programs. The regulations include specific details for organics waste collection and food recovery programs that must be implemented by all jurisdictions, and requires enforcement and reporting on these programs to demonstrate compliance. Given the significant and sweeping changes to California's handling of waste, this bill has also been in the rulemaking process for a number of years, and has been delayed even further since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic.

The final rulemaking was completed by CalRecycle on November 3, 2020, and jurisdictions have one year to prepare, as many of the regulations go into effect as soon as January 1, 2022.

# **Consultant Selection and SB 1383 Implementation Plan Process**

The City released a Request for Proposals (RFP) in August this year, for a consultant firm to aid in the development of a City of Davis specific implementation plan for SB 1383. The chosen consultant firm will undertake an investigation of SB 1383 organics reduction requirements that pertain to the City, provide a report on their findings (including the identification of gaps that the City currently has to meet the regulations of SB 1383), and present the findings to City Commissions (the Natural Resources and Utilities Commissions) as well as the City Council. The Commissions will use the plan and work with staff to advise Council on the ultimate implementation of the regulations.

Staff received two proposals from consultants through the RFP process. Staff reviewed the proposals, and selected the firm that provided the most comprehensive and thorough proposal. The consultant selection will go to City Council on December 15 for approval. The anticipated timeline for the implementation plan is provided below.
