Item 6A – Wastewater Cost of Service Study: Financial Plan Review January 20, 2021

Materials for Review

Budget Summaries

To inform the review of the utility, fiscal year (FY) budget summaries for Wastewater Funds 531, 532 and 533 are included as Attachment 1.

The information is broken out in three sections:

- Fund balance (broken out by fund).
- Sources of revenue (broken out by major source).
- Expenditures (broken out by program, Capital Improvement Projects (CIPs) and debt service).

Each section includes City budget and actual accounting data for fiscal years (FY) 2017-2018, 2018-2019, 2019-20 and the budget for FY 2020-2021.

Some considerations in reviewing the summaries:

- The summaries are provided to show revenue and expenditures in a straightforward format. The spreadsheet is not a model.
- A total is included at the bottom of the chart comparing simplified total revenue and expenditures for all three funds combined. Years where the total expenditures exceed revenue demonstrate when project funding would come from existing fund balance.
- Costs year-by-year associated with professional services and capital improvement projects will vary significantly, based on timing of projects and large studies.
- Non-professional services and CIP costs that show significant changes are highlighted in the document, with notes on the right of the chart to identify the cause of the change.

Note: there are two outstanding loans associated with the Wastewater Utility, a \$3M loan for Solid Waste, and a \$2M loan for Stormwater. As of the creation of this report, no principal payments have been made on these loans (currently both utilities are paying interest-only payments, as required by the interfund loan agreements), and it is not anticipated that the loans will be repaid* within the five-year rate adjustment window currently under discussion. Annual fund updates for the Wastewater Utility will update the Commission on the status of the loan repayments.

*Stormwater repayments could begin sooner than anticipated should the proposed rate adjustments be approved by voters.
