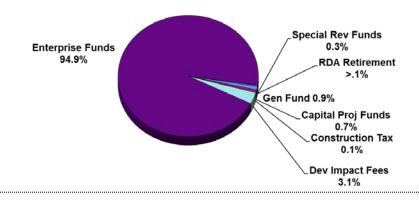
STATEMENT OF PURPOSE
