The Section 106 Process

The proposed project was analyzed in the 70-acre 500+ West Davis Active Adult Community Project (Master Plan) approved by the voters of Davis in 2018 and fulfills the affordability obligations of the master development negotiated with the City. A record search and Native American consultation in compliance with AB 52 was conducted for the Master Plan EIR. Since approval of the Master Plan the site has been raised with 4 to 5 feet of fill above the original elevation, prior to the expectation of federal funding.

An updated records search of the project site and 100-meter buffer was requested from the Northwest Information Center. The record search results did not identify any historic and prehistoric cultural resources recorded in the project area. One resource was recorded within 100 meters of the project site.

A search of the Native American Heritage Commission (NAHC) Sacred Lands File was initiated for the project area on June 12, 2023; the request is still being processed. Pursuant to Section 106, consultation was initiated with known Native American Tribes in the region on June 14, 2023 based on the City of Davis's Tribal Consultation list, to solicit feedback regarding potential Native American resources within or in proximity to the project site. Follow up emails were made June 22, 2023. No response has been received to date. A log of communication is provided in Attachment 5.

The City of Davis has determined that the proposed undertaking would have no adverse effect on a historic resource.

SHPO replied on August 31, 2023 and concurs with the determination of no adverse effect on a historic resource.

The following mitigation measures would be implemented:

Historic	Preser	vation

National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, particularly sections 106 and 110; 36 CFR Part 800 MM CUL-1: Cultural Awareness Training Program. If determined warranted during ongoing tribal consultation, a Cultural Awareness Training Program shall be provided to all construction managers and construction personnel prior to commencing ground disturbance work at the project site. The training shall be prepared and conducted by the designated local Tribe. The training shall be a length of time adequate to explain applicable statues, regulations, enforcement provisions; the prehistoric and historic environmental setting and context, of the local tribal groups; show sample artifacts; and what prehistoric and historic archaeological deposits look like at the surface and when exposed during construction. The training may be discontinued for new workers to the site when ground disturbance is completed. Construction personnel shall not be permitted to operate equipment within the construction area unless they have attended the training. A list of the names of all personnel who attended the training and copies of the signed acknowledgement forms shall be submitted to the City of Davis for their review and approval.

MM CUL-2: Cultural Resources Construction Monitoring. If determined warranted during ongoing tribal consultation, a qualified Tribal Cultural Monitor shall be continuously present onsite during ground disturbing activities, and on-call during trenching activities, to observe disturbance areas. The qualified Monitor or contractor shall halt work in the immediate vicinity if artifacts, exotic rock, shell, or bone are uncovered during the construction. In the event such cultural resources are unearthed during ground disturbing activities, and the qualified Monitor is not in that location, the project operator shall cease all ground-disturbing activities within one hundred feet of the find and immediately contact the qualified Monitor. Work shall not resume until the potential resource can be evaluated by the qualified Monitor. The qualified Monitor shall be empowered to halt or redirect ground-disturbing activities away from the vicinity of the find until the qualified Monitor has evaluated the find, determined whether the find is culturally sensitive, and designed an appropriate short term and long-term treatment plan. The Monitor shall determine the significance of the finding. If determined to be significant the Monitor shall prepare a treatment plan in consultation with local experts, Native American Representatives, and the City of Davis.

MM CUL-3: Discovery of Unknown Resources. The project applicant shall continuously comply with the following requirement: If unanticipated cultural or tribal cultural resources are encountered while grading or construction, the project operator/contractor shall cease any ground-disturbing activities within one hundred feet of the find. Cultural and/or tribal cultural resources may include prehistoric archaeological materials such as flaked and ground stone tools and debris, shell, bone, ceramics, and fire-affected rock, as well as historic materials such as glass, metal, wood, brick, or structural remnants. A qualified Monitor shall evaluate the resource and recommend treatment measures, as appropriate.

The California State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO) received the consultation submittal for the above referenced undertaking for our review and comment pursuant to Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act and its implementing regulations found at 36 CFR Part 800. The City of Davis requested the SHPO's review and comment on the finding of No Adverse Effect to historic properties for this undertaking.

The SHPO responded to your original letter with a request for additional information. Consultant Gail Ervin emailed a follow-up letter on August 2, 2023 that provided the requested information.

Undertaking

The City of Davis (City) proposes to implement the Bretton Woods Senior Apartments Project (project). The project is located on 39660 West Covell Boulevard in the City of Davis, Yolo County, and is an integral part of the West Davis Active Adult Community Project currently under construction. The project would provide a total of 150 affordable residential units with a combination of studios, one-, and two-bedroom units appealing to a variety of household sizes. The project would be developed in two phases with Phase I consisting of one 75-unit four-story building located on the eastern portion of the parcel as well as community center, and Phase II consisting of the remaining 75-unit four-story building located on the western portion of the parcel.

Area of Potential Effect (APE)

The City of Davis delineated the APE as the approximately 3.71-acre project site located within one parcel (APN: 036-060-004) within Township 8 North, Range 2 East, and Section 5 and adjacent parcels within the viewshed. The vertical APE for this project is 10 feet below ground level.

Pursuant to 36 CFR § 800.4(a)(1), I have no comments on the City of Davis's APE.

Identification of Historic Properties

The City of Davis's efforts to identify historic properties included a records search at the Northwest Information Center and a Sacred Lands File search from the Native American Heritage Commission (NAHC). The records search indicated that no archaeological sites had been previously recorded within the project APE. The Sacred Lands File search from NAHC was negative.

Tribal Consultation

The City of Davis initiated consultation with known Native American Tribes in the region on June 14, 2023 based on the City of Davis's Tribal Consultation list, to solicit feedback regarding potential Native American resources within or in proximity to the project site. Follow up emails were sent on June 22, 2023. The Yoche Dehe Tribe requested cultural sensitivity training for personnel on this project; the City will contact the Yoche Dehe to schedule training before construction begins.

Finding of Effect

 Pursuant to 36 CFR § 800.5(b) the City of Davis has made a finding of No Adverse Effect. I do not object.

In your response dated July 27, 2023, your office requested further information regarding the City of Davis (City) Bretton Woods Senior Apartments Project (project). This is a critical affordable housing project for the City that is facing a funding deadline, therefore your expedited review of this additional information and concurrence would be greatly appreciated.

Undertaking

Please provide more project details regarding construction activities. To what depth does the
 City anticipate ground-disturbing activities?

Project construction is anticipated to be up to 10 feet deep for utilities. The site had been raised with 4 to 6 feet of fill above the original elevation, prior to the expectation of federal funding, thus depth below ground level would be 4 to 6 feet at utility extensions.

Area of Potential Effect (APE)

Please provide a vertical aspect to the APE as defined above.

Page 5 of the City's submittal identifies both the Direct and Indirect APE on the figure. As can be seen on the aerial image, all properties to the west, north, and east are vacant and are a part of the master plan under construction; the area has historically been agriculture. The University Retirement Community, approximately 280 to the south, was constructed in 1993. The Saratoga West Apartments, adjacent to the retirement community, were also constructed sometime after 1993. Therefore, there are no historic properties within the direct or indirect APE.

Although NAHC indicates they sent the response on 6/29/23, a review of our records indicated it was not received until today. The Sacred Lands search conducted by the Native American Heritage Commission was negative. Please see Attachment 1.

 Please provide to the SHPO any comments or concerns the City of Davis received from Tribes notified of the undertaking through July 14, 2023.

The Yocha Dehe Wintun Nation just responded on July 28, 2023 that based on the information provided, Yocha Dehe Wintun Nation is not aware of any known cultural resources near this project site and a cultural monitor is not needed (Attachment 2). However, they recommend cultural sensitivity training for any pre-project personnel to be added to the permit as a condition of approval. The UAIC has standard mitigation measures for training and unanticipated discoveries in cases where they don't respond, which are included in the environmental assessment for this project; the City will contact the Yocha Dehe to schedule the training before construction begins. Letters have been sent to the new federal tribes identified in the late NAHC notice (Attachment 3).

The City of Davis has determined that the proposed undertaking would have no adverse effect on a historic resource. We are requesting your concurrence with this determination as specified in the Programmatic Agreement.

Dear Ms. Laitinen:

Pursuant to Public Resources Code section 21080.3.1 (c), attached is a consultation list of tribes that are traditionally and culturally affiliated with the geographic area of the above-listed project. Please note that the intent of the AB 52 amendments to CEQA is to avoid and/or mitigate impacts to tribal cultural resources, (Pub. Resources Code §21084.3 (a)) ("Public agencies shall, when feasible, avoid damaging effects to any tribal cultural resource.")

Public Resources Code sections 21080.3.1 and 21084.3(c) require CEQA lead agencies to consult with California Native American tribes that have requested notice from such agencies of proposed projects in the geographic area that are traditionally and culturally affiliated with the tribes on projects for which a Notice of Preparation or Notice of Negative Declaration or Mitigated Negative Declaration has been filed on or after July 1, 2015. Specifically, Public Resources Code section 21080.3.1 (d) provides:

Within 14 days of determining that an application for a project is complete or a decision by a public agency to undertake a project, the lead agency shall provide formal notification to the designated contact of, or a tribal representative of, traditionally and culturally affiliated California Native American tribes that have requested notice, which shall be accomplished by means of at least one written notification that includes a brief description of the proposed project and its location, the lead agency contact information, and a notification that the California Native American tribe has 30 days to request consultation pursuant to this section.

The AB 52 amendments to CEQA law does not preclude initiating consultation with the tribes that are culturally and traditionally affiliated within your jurisdiction prior to receiving requests for notification of projects in the tribe's areas of traditional and cultural affiliation. The Native American Heritage Commission (NAHC) recommends, but does not require, early consultation as a best practice to ensure that lead agencies receive sufficient information about cultural resources in a project area to avoid damaging effects to tribal cultural resources.

The NAHC also recommends, but does not require that agencies should also include with their notification letters, information regarding any cultural resources assessment that has been completed on the area of potential effect (APE), such as:

1. The results of any record search that may have been conducted at an Information Center of the California Historical Resources Information System (CHRIS), including, but not limited to:

- A listing of any and all known cultural resources that have already been recorded on or adjacent to the APE, such as known archaeological sites;
- Copies of any and all cultural resource records and study reports that may have been provided by the Information Center as part of the records search response;
- Whether the records search indicates a low, moderate, or high probability that unrecorded cultural resources are located in the APE; and
- If a survey is recommended by the Information Center to determine whether previously unrecorded cultural resources are present.
- 2. The results of any archaeological inventory survey that was conducted, including:
 - Any report that may contain site forms, site significance, and suggested mitigation measures.

All information regarding site locations, Native American human remains, and associated funerary objects should be in a separate confidential addendum, and not be made available for public disclosure in accordance with Government Code section 6254.10.

- 3. The result of any Sacred Lands File (SLF) check conducted through the Native American Heritage Commission was <u>negative</u>.
- 4. Any ethnographic studies conducted for any area including all or part of the APE; and
- 5. Any geotechnical reports regarding all or part of the APE.

Lead agencies should be aware that records maintained by the NAHC and CHRIS are not exhaustive and a negative response to these searches does not preclude the existence of a tribal cultural resource. A tribe may be the only source of information regarding the existence of a tribal cultural resource.

This information will aid tribes in determining whether to request formal consultation. In the event that they do, having the information beforehand will help to facilitate the consultation process.

If you receive notification of change of addresses and phone numbers from tribes, please notify the NAHC. With your assistance, we can assure that our consultation list remains current.

The City of Davis (City) proposes to implement the Bretton Woods Senior Apartments Project (project). The project is located on 39660 West Covell Boulevard in the City of Davis, Yolo County, and is an integral part of the West Davis Active Adult Community Project currently under construction. The project would provide a total of 150 affordable residential units with a combination of studios, one-, and two-bedroom units appealing to a variety of household sizes. The project would be developed in two phases with Phase I consisting of one 75-unit four-story building located on the eastern portion of the parcel as well as community center, and Phase II consisting of the remaining 75-unit four-story building located on the western portion of the parcel.

The proposed project was analyzed in the 70-acre, 500-plus units West Davis Active Adult Community Project (Master Plan) approved by the voters of Davis in 2018 and fulfills the affordability obligations of the master development negotiated with the City. A record search and Native American consultation in compliance with AB 52 was conducted for the Master Plan EIR . Since approval of the Master Plan the site has been raised with 4 to 5 feet of fill above the original elevation, prior to the expectation of federal funding.

The approximately 3.71-acre project site is located within one parcel (APN: 036-060-004) within Township 8 North, Range 2 East, and Section 5. Two maps are enclosed for your review (Attachments 1 and 2). Figure 1 is a location map of the project area at a 1:24,000 scale with a USGS 7.5' quadrangle background (Merritt). Figure 2 is a detailed map with aerial imagery. The area of potential effect (APE) has been defined as the project parcel and adjacent parcels within the viewshed (Figure 3).

An updated records search of the project site and 100-meter buffer was requested from the Northwest Information Center (Attachment 4). The record search results did not

identify any historic and prehistoric cultural resources recorded in the project area. One resource was recorded within 100 meters of the project site.

A search of the Native American Heritage Commission (NAHC) Sacred Lands File was initiated for the project area on June 12, 2023; the request is still being processed. Pursuant to Section 106, consultation was initiated with known Native American Tribes in the region on June 14, 2023 based on the City of Davis's Tribal Consultation list, to solicit feedback regarding potential Native American resources within or in proximity to the project site. Follow up emails were made June 22, 2023. No response has been received to date. A log of communication is provided in Attachment 5.

The City of Davis has determined that the proposed undertaking would have no adverse effect on a historic resource. We are requesting your concurrence with this determination as specified in the Programmatic Agreement.
