About the Author

Dante Gabriel Rossetti (1828 - 1882) was a British poet, illustrator, painter, and translator. He founded the Pre-Raphaelite Brotherhood in 1848. Rossetti often produced works in tandem, either creating a painting and then a poem to accompany it, or vice versa. His work helped shape the Victorian era and provided a much needed commentary on Victorian daily life.

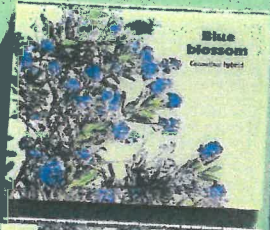


What is a native plant?
