1. Call to Order & Roll Call

2. Designation of Chair for Day – Lucas Frerichs

3. Approval of Agenda

6. Discussion Items

A. Crisis Now Update

Yolo County Director of Health & Human Services Nolan Sullivan: Provided a handout and brief history on Crisis Now and explained the services provided. As of January 1, 2024 there is 24/7 coverage across Yolo County for individuals to call when in crisis.

Currently in phase 4, which includes funding requests from partners and cities. Phase 5 is the 24/7 receiving center for crisis or sobering needs. Currently working on the construction cycle for that.

The County has identified funding for a bulk short-term. There is a \$4.5 million gap in funding for the receiving center.

Many construction projects are taking longer for completion. It's projected that construction will take place sometime around summer of 2025 although efforts are being made to speed up the process.

County is asking for a \$930K contribution from the City of Davis over three fiscal years (\$310K/fiscal year) for the receiving center.

Currently there is one co-responder (AMR), but there will never have 24/7 coverage with co-responders because it's too expensive. Coverage goes until 8 pm and clinical staff are on standby at all hours as well as responding through telehealth. Initial pilot is showing a significant decrease in hospital visits for crisis.

N. Sullivan: explained that the funding gaps are inclusive of the amount that is expected to be collected by billing private insurance.

L. Frerichs: Proposed, that if the City and County are willing, UCD should be approached to contribute funding to this program.

Karleen Jakowski: shared that there is pending legislation (AB-2700) that's been drafted, seeking to increase access to treatment.

M. Webb: Shared that Davis is committed to the contribution for this program.

G. Pinedo: This is a huge priority for the CAO's office and will be seeking some legislative alternatives over the coming years. Shared that there's been a joint earmark request through members of the House of Representatives.

No public comment.

7. Board of Supervisors/City Council Communications

J. Provenza: would like to add an update on Pacifico Housing, and the possible participation of UC Davis students in housing discussions to a future meeting. Proposed holding a meeting in April to discuss these items.

G: Pinedo: There are some issues that are being worked through with Pacifico, if progress can be made there, perhaps a meeting can be scheduled.
