Continued Closure of G Street

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History

- G Street from 2nd to 3rd was closed to automobile traffic in response to COVID restrictions.
- Since then minor changes have occurred:
 - Placement of the bollards
 - Relocation of the south end of the closure to be just north of the G
 Street parking lot

Outreach

Staff has presented 4 options (shown in slides 4-8) to the adjacent businesses and other stakeholders including:

- Downtown Davis Business Association
- Chamber of Commerce
- BTSSC



Option 1: Reopen the street

Would restore the street to what existed prior to COVID.

2 travel lanes

Angled parking on both sides



Option 2: Keep the street closed to automobile traffic

This would include:

- Developing a set of standards for the outdoor retail and dining areas
- Identifying responsibilities for maintenance of the areas, such as litter removal and regular sweeping.
- Identify costs and fees fee associated with permitting the outdoor dining areas.
- Maintain emergency vehicle access.



The Paseo on G Street: A New and Enhanced Downtown Davis Experience

KEY IMPROVEMENTS:

- Decorative bollards restrict vehicles from entering into G Street except for emergency access.
- Intersection is realigned to allow for a shorter pedestrian crossing distance.
- 3 Enhanced paving for central pedestrian and bike circulation.
- New and expanded entry landscape area.
- G Street decorative entry walls and signage.
- Existing sidewalk areas to remain the same.
- Northbound vehicular/bike access only.
- 8 Landscape strip separates southbound bicyclists from vehicles.
- Intersection is realigned to allow for a bike and pedestrian mixing zone.
- Bollards protect bikes and pedestrians from
- Bike parking alcoves.
- Boardwalks allow for barrier-free access to seating and restaurant dining areas. Cohesive string lighting is placed over boardwalk/seating zones.
- Enhanced landscaping and seatwalls allow for additional public realm space.
- Raised landscape planters provide enclosure of boardwalk/seating zones.
- Existing plaza space to remain in place.







Option 3: Reopen the road but allow full closures

- Allow full closures for part of the week or special events.
- While fully open would restore the street to what existed prior to COVID.
 - 2 travel lanes
 - Angled parking on both sides



Option 4: Reopen the northbound lane only

- Would allow for expanded sidewalk and patio space.
- Allows for some one-way automobile access and parking.
- Would need to determine what other roadway features would be desired.
 - Parallel parking on both sides
 - Southbound bicycle lane



Outreach Summary

- Concerns about the appearance of G Street Lack of standards, use of temporary materials, not cohesive.
- Concerns about the cleanliness of G Street Who maintains the area.
- Concerns about the equality Who get permits and how much does it cost.
- Concerns about access Related to the lack of automobile access and parking.



Outreach Summary

- BTSSC Voted to pursue option 2 with the following considerations:
 - Evaluate ADA access and parking near G Street
 - Consider creating outdoor dining/gathering places that are not reserved for a individual business
- DDBA Surveyed their membership and:
 - 40% prefer to reopen the street to automobiles (option 1)
 - 30% prefer to keep it closed to automobiles (option 2)
 - 20% prefer option 3
 - 10% prefer option 4


