A. Public Forum on Recent Hate Incidents in the Davis Community

The Human Relations Commission provided an opportunity to discuss and receive public input on recent hate incidents in the Davis community, including, but not limited to.

- Hate commentary during the Davis Senior High School Homecoming Parade
- o Drawing of swastikas found in residential communities.
- UC Davis speaker incident resulting in violence

Commissioner Comments:

- Hearing more and more about how showing up in solidarity to events and meetings is helpful.
- Statement that the City put out in regards to Hate incidents on September
 30
 - Ways the statement could be more specific and action oriented
 - Statement had passive language and somewhat vague
 - Sharing resources and talking to local community who might know how to address
 - Focused on council members themselves, suggest changing wording since coming from people of power
 - Refine verbiage to come out more strongly in condemning
 - Incidents are part of larger structural pattern that should be addressed

Public Comments:

USMC - Takes issue with the comment that police might be an option on side of Proud Boys or affiliated. First amendment was violated yesterday. Most

conservative person should be able to come to Davis to speak and have the right to do so.

Commissioner Gavin – First ten amendments are important, but not really emphasized. Important to not encroach on free speech, even is discourse is not always nice. The right to say it is protected.

B. Thong Hy Huynh Nomination Process Review

Commissioners Willson and Gorman have reviewed the current nomination process for the annual Thong Hy Huynh awards and provided suggested revisions for the Commission to consider.

- Online submittal form would be helpful
- o Thought to remove categories and focus on characteristics/contributions
- Make sure to consider youth representation
- o Perhaps keep Lifetime Achievement
- Overall theme that Huynh encompasses qualities and has a youth and adult award, etc.
- o Focus on spirit of award and not category
