The professional and dedicated staff of the Davis Police Department serves a diverse community of approximately 66,000 residents and students, and thousands of visitors each day. Our authorized strength consists of 90 employees (60 sworn officers and 30 civilian support professionals).

The members of the Davis Police Department take tremendous pride in providing the public with outstanding police service and we are proud of the reputation they have earned for contributing to the vibrancy and the quality of life our community enjoys. Our continuing commitment to the delivery of responsive and fair police services is just one, yet crucial, part of the entire City of Davis government team's mission to ensure a safe, healthy and equitable community and enhance a vibrant downtown and thriving neighborhoods.

During 2024, Davis Police Department personnel responded to 44,294 calls for service, made 1,344 arrests and issued 3,232 moving citations. Personnel also attended many events, forums, presentations and worked with a variety of community organizations and groups in many different ways.

In 2024, the Davis Police Department published the 2024 – 2027 Strategic Plan. One of the Strategic Plan goals was to model and pursue excellence by partnering with our community. Towards this end, maintaining positive community relations and creating partnerships are essential elements of our service delivery plan. In order to earn and maintain community support, one of our objectives is to provide transparency in policing in Davis and provide information to the public in a timely, efficient, effective and respectful manner. This includes annually posting summary use of force data from the previous year on the Department's website.

Department Use of Force Policy

The Department made significant changes to the Use of Force Policy in 2020, 2021, and 2022 relating to the passage of [AB 392](#)¹, [SB 230](#)², and guidelines issued by the California Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training, along with providing officer training regarding the policy updates³.

Beginning in 2017, the following types of force are annually reported to the public:

1. The use of a firearm or deadly force.
2. The use of a baton or impact device/munitions.
3. The use of a Taser.
4. The use of oleoresin capsicum (pepper spray) or chemical agents.
5. The use of physical strikes or knee strikes.

In 2024 there was 5 incidents of force reportable on the annual report.

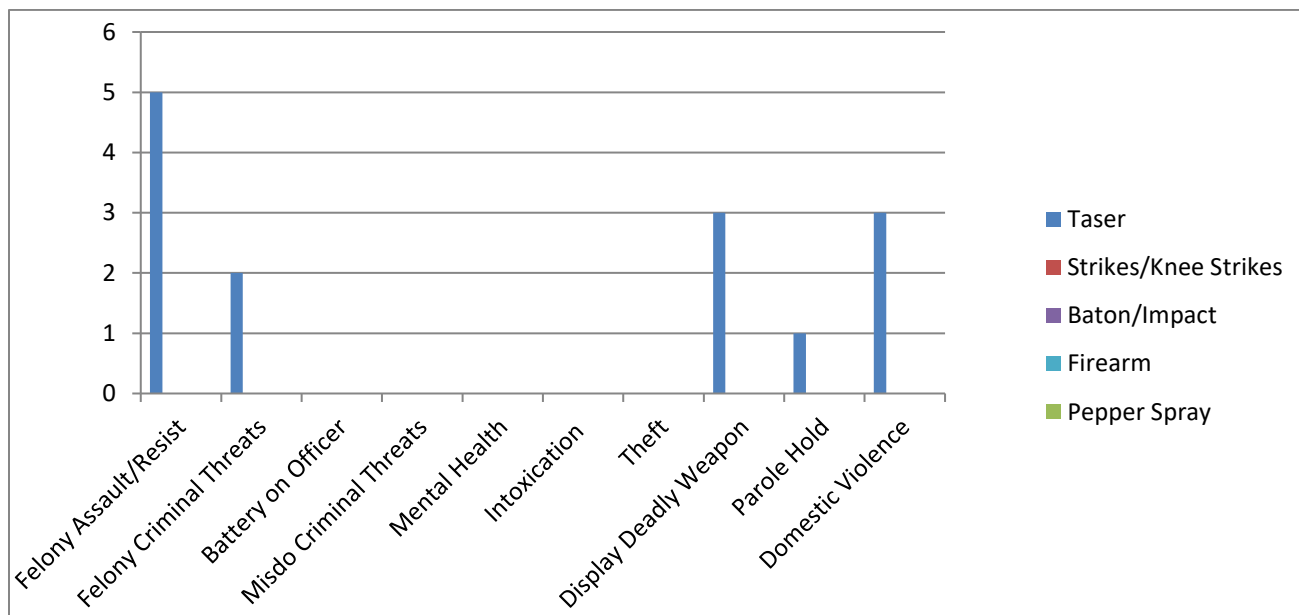
